### HAPPY DAYS



There are several ways in which you can help the society with a legacy, but your preferred way needs to be included in your will. If you have already made a will you need simply to ask your solicitor to add a short statement. It is important to get the wording right so that it states clearly what you wish to happen.

If you are making a will for the first time simply ask the solicitor to include the statement which best suits your intentions.



HPS at CHELSEA

We have set out three forms of wording to cover **three different sorts** of intention. It will assist the solicitor who is helping you with your will if you take a copy of one of these when you discuss your legacy. The society can arrange for a suitable inscription in our Book of Benefactors in each case.

### THE FIXED SUM LEGACY

*“I give to the Hardy Plant Society, registered charity number 208080, 15, Basepoint Business Centre, Crab Apple Way, Evesham, WR11 1GP, the sum of £... .. and I direct (i) that the proceeds may be used for the general purposes (\*) of the Hardy Plant Society, and (ii) that a receipt signed by a person for the time being authorised by the Trustees of the Hardy Plant Society shall be a good and sufficient discharge to my executors.”*
